October President Report

We are ready to start the Poppy Campaign on Friday, October 28th at 4 locations with a poppy table. We also have volunteers looking after businesses in various parts of Medicine Hat delivering Poppy Boxes and Poppies for the general public.

Thank you in advance to everyone who has signed up to work at the tables located at the following locations: Canadian Tire, The Mall near the Food Court Entrance, Walmart and 13th Avenue Co-op. Instructions are on the table if this is your first time with the Poppy Campaign. Please leave the instructions on the table at the end of the day. A big thank you to the route volunteers as well. Taking responsibility for a particular route is a time consuming commitment. We are still in need of volunteers to help in the Poppy Office and someone willing to help take the wreaths to the Cenotaph on November 11th.

I would be remiss if I did not mention the three cadet corps and their assistance on both weekends during the campaign and the part they are playing in the ceremony at the Esplanade and at the Cenotaph. Their volunteering is very much appreciated. Also the Golden K Kiwanis Club has volunteered to work both Wednesdays and both Thursdays at Canadian Tire. We thank them for their support and continued help.

The plans for November 11th include the following:

We will have the usual bus pick up at the Legion to take those who cannot walk to the Esplanade and then to the Cenotaph and after the Cenotaph Service back to the Legion. 9:00 O'clock departure from the Legion to Esplanade and then pick up after the ceremony to cenotaph and then back to the Legion after the Remembrance Day Service. Thank you to the City Transit for making this service available to our Veterans.

Breakfast will be available from 7-9am and the lunch will be, beef on a bun, cheesy macaroni and coleslaw for \$10.00.

At 9:30 the Service of Remembrance begins at the Esplanade. After the service the parade will form up just outside the Esplanade with Robert McKenzie as Parade Commander. The Colour Party will be under the direction of Scott Schall. The parade will proceed to the cenotaph for the Service and the wreath laying. After the Service at the cenotaph the parade will march back to the Legion. If you have any questions, please call the Legion.

Once the parade is back at the Legion, the CAV's will be taking care of security. The only way in will be the front door. Colour party will enter first and they have a table reserved for them in the canteen. All those on parade enter next, then military, veterans, police and fire service and also Legion members. Cadets and children will go downstairs for hotdogs and a drink. No children will be allowed in the canteen. The Pub will be open for those wishing to go there instead of the canteen. If you would like to volunteer in anyway please let the office know. We need volunteers for the 50/50, to help with the hotdogs, or just help out as needed throughout the afternoon.

On October 15th we celebrated Roy Gale's passing in the Ortona Room. We learned so much about Roy from his family. There were at least 150 in attendance to wish Roy farewell, May he rest in peace.
